Police Updates – Deputy Chief Andrew Perry

Confirmed new Chief Constable is Paul Hyland. Now running a two Deputy Chief model. From a staffing standpoint – we are overall doing very well. We are continuing to have an increased presence of officers in the downtown area.

Questions:

Q: Are your staffing levels impacted by the Surrey Police Service?

A: We have lost some members and are expected to lose the occasional member. We continue to hire new recruits as well as experienced officers from other organizations.

Q: What caused the increase presence of officers in the downtown area?

A: Downtown and Uptown areas of New West are our highest areas for calls for service. There has always been a higher presence of officers in those areas (for example, our Crime Reduction Unit). It is not often we have random assaults in New Westminster. The recent random assault was a trigger point for increasing officer presence in the downtown area.

Q: How is the City's Crisis Response Pilot Project going?

A: It is a city lead project. We are part of the stakeholders at the table to help with decision making (for example, assisting city staff if they feel unsafe attending certain locations). We are very supportive of the city and this project, but we cannot share any stats or information on how the project is going.

Q: Does the new involuntary care expansion allow police to apprehend more people?

A: The powers that we have to apprehend under the Mental Health Act have always existed. Nothing has changed for us. After we bring someone to the hospital, it us up to a specialist to make the decision if they will remain under involuntary care or not.

Q: Are there regular patrols in Queensborough at night when many parkade break ins have happened?

A: Queensborough is an area that we do regular patrols in. In the last six months there have been a total of four underground parkade break ins that have been reported.

Q: Are there any issues associated with Mazarine Lodge?

A: Assuming that this is referring to crime or public safety issues – in general we are not concerned.

Q: Will there be a system set up so that the public will be aware of anything going on in their neighborhood?

A: If there is an in progress incident that involves public risk – those that need to be notified will be notified (for example, officers knocking on doors, social media alerts)

Q: Are there plans to bring back the online crime map?



A: We recently did a significant upgrade to our file management system making it no longer compatible with our crime map. We are looking to find a cost effective solution to this issue.

Q: Why is there an apparent lack of bike patrols in the West End?

A: The West End is not a high calls for service area for us. Most of our bike patrols are going to be focused on our high calls for service areas – downtown and uptown.

Q: How many commercial vehicle inspections have been conducted on East 10th?

A: Our Commercial Vehicle Inspector spends time on East 10th Avenue every shift he works. He has also worked in conjunction with Burnaby RCMP 3 times this year where they set up a formal commercial vehicle roadblock on East 10th avenue.

Q: How many tickets have been issued for Unnecessary Noise?

A: 2025x1, 2024x0, 2023x3, 2022x1, 2021x1, 2020x0

Q: Are there any vacancies in the Traffic Unit?

A: At our last meeting there was one vacancy – it has now been filled.
