ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

We held an annual general meeting on January 13th. A new president, Sherry Messenger, and a new Vice President, Derek Deacon, were elected. Chester Kniec joined us as a new Director-at-Large. Our speakers were Sharat Chandra, Chief Project Officer and Executive Director of the Royal Columbian Hospital Re-development Project, who gave us an informative overview of the phases completed to date and timelines for yet to be completed development. Deputy Chief Constable Paul Hyland spoke about reforms currently underway in the way that the New Westminster Police perform their work. He referenced their supporting role in the Peer Assisted Crisis Team (PACT) pilot project managed by the Canadian Mental Health Association to help address issues resulting from people with mental health and substance abuse issues. GENERAL MEETING

Our next general meeting is on June 9th at 7 pm at the Mount Zion Lutheran Church, basement entrance. She will be speaking on the Laneway and Carriage House as well as Phase One of the Infill Housing Monitoring work. She will provide background and an overview of both, as well as some detail as to how privacy and planning for parking – both issues that will affect neighbouring homes – will be reviewed. Her presentation will be followed by a Q&A, a brief presentation by an MVH resident who has had an experience with a neighbour's laneway house, and finally a market overview from MVHRA's sponsor, realtor John Cooke. POLICE COMMITTEE

Recent Issues:

There have been numerous reports over the last few years of **thefts of catalytic converters** from vehicles for the precious metals contained in them.

On March 4th, a resident of our neighbourhood was pepper-sprayed when confronting thieves attempting to remove the catalytic converter from a vehicle. The New West police file # is 22-3335. The police are asking if anyone has video footage of the street from 2:30AM to 3:30AM on that day.

There has also been a reported incident of a man (*Caucasian, blue eyes, late 60s early 70s*) in a green Toyota pick-up truck helping himself to items from a backyard in the neighbourhood on March 4th at 10 am. The resident caught him in the act and he returned the items. Police reported that this was not an isolated incident. If you are aware of or witness any other incidents involving this man taking items from other yards, please report them as indicated below:

We recommend reporting all such incidents to the police as this helps them establish patterns of theft behaviour and respond accordingly.

Please remember to close the door firmly after browsing to protect the books from the weather – and do not leave books lying on the ground. Thanks for your cooperation.

REAL ESTATE MARKET REPORT

I hope everyone had a great fall/winter season. I'm sure we're all ready for some sun and the spring season a few weeks away.

The market for detached homes in Massey Victory Heights through the fall/winter was very active with the continuation of more record sales. A total of 16 homes sold in the past 3 months and 24 in the past 6 months within 14 days on average with the majority of them going into multiple offers and 17 selling above list price. They are currently 16 active listings in our neighbourhood as of March 8.

What continues to help drive the market is historically low interest rates and low inventory. Even with the most recent hike in interest rates, the market will continue to be strong as it's mainly driven by supply and demand. We'll see more listings become available after spring break. Will there be enough inventory to slow the market down? We'll have to wait and see. If you're looking to make a move or just have questions, please reach out as I'm here to help in any way I can.
